I John Turner of New Haven son. Johanna Bertram
of Guilford, Conn. Dec. 16, 1686. She d. Dec 29,
1692. He m. 2nd. Elizabeth Baskin June 1699.
He d. Nov. 1696 at Guilford, Conn.
(These records can all be seen at the Court House
at Guilford)

II Benjamin Turner son of John b. 1689, m.
March 31, 1720 Martha Chapman. He d. at
Killingworth, Conn. Nov. 25, 1776
(see his tombstone in Sord's Lane
burial ground, Killingworth)

III Jacob Turner son of Benj., b. May 3, 1731,
m. Jane Woodworth 1754(?) d. 1762
(see vol. 2 of Land Records & Vital
Statistics of Killingworth, Conn.
(Mr. Chittenden, Town Clerk)

IV William Turner son of Jacob, b. Jan. 7, 1756
m. Hannah Williams —, d. in New York City.
(for record of birth see vol. 2. Land Records
& Vital Statistics of Killingworth p. 292)

V Almerin, son of William, b. Jan. 10, 1780, m.
Hannah Dubbs, d. Sept. 3, 1873
1808 Ulreland, N. J.

VI Edwin Morgan Turner b. Dec. 3, 1824, m. Feb. 1,
1855 Martha Sinda Ellis, d. July 20, 1895

William Turner ^{in Killingworth, Conn.} (born Jan. 7, 1756) enlisted
d. in ^{near} ~~near~~ ^{of} ~~of~~ ^{the} ~~the~~ ^{city} ~~city~~
from Killingworth, Conn., under Capt.
Edward Shipman and served at the
siege of Boston. Served from July 26 to
Dec. 18, 1775.

Also served in Col. Huntington's
regiment under Capt. Brownbridge
and also in Capt. Allen's company.
March 6, 1777 he enlisted for three
years in Capt. Shumway's Co.

John Tubbs enlisted in the Connecticut
(born 1760 in Lyme, Conn.)
militia in 1778 ^{under Capt Seth M. Holmes} and served from Aug. 3

to Sept. 14, 1778 and was at the battle of
Rhode Island. Pension Census of 1840
gives his age as 80 years. "Conn. Men"
p. 661.

In 1779 John Tubbs was
drafted for 6 months under probably
Capt. John Beebe and was ordered
to New London, where he joined
the command of Col. Sedgwick on
Satimer. First stationed near
Fort Trumbull, then in patrol
from Lyme to Millstone; served
Apr. to Nov. 1779. John Tubbs served
four weeks in Conn. militia.
